



- Thriving Practice: Self & Collective Care How can we build and strengthen strategies and skills to care for ourselves and one another within complex healthcare systems?





Clinical Practice in the BSN Program:




- Avg. number of practice hours in North American BSN programs = 925 (Cipher et al., 2021; CA, TX, NY, FL, PA, IL US State Boards of Nursing)
- UBC V direct practice hours = Approximately 965 "hands-on" hours in practice or simulation including 312 1:1 preceptorship/consolidation practice hours
 - Plus, an additional ~ 300 hours that include onsite preparation, post-conference instruction, etc.




Students will always have two days off per week although they may not always be consecutive days.
